- I. The participant's legal guardians will grant to USA Program full authority to carry out, undertake, and make decisions for all matters relating to the participant's well being and academics.
- II. The participant must obey all local, state, and federal laws while residing in the U.S. and agree to hold the program harmless from any liability arising from a violation of any of these laws.
- III. The participant must accept and obey all house rules that are set forth by the host family. The participant must take part in host family activities and is to demonstrate respect, care, and understanding at all times to the host family.
- IV. To contact exclusively USA staff members whenever I need additional help in situations that are not resolved within my host family.
- V. The participant must have sufficient spending money to cover all personal expenses for the duration of the USA program, including but not limited to the following: all long distance phone calls, postage, school transportation /supplies /tuition /lunch /uniforms /books /extracurricular activities/fees, personal hygiene products, entertainment, dining out, travel expenses, etc.
- VI. The participant is prohibited from becoming involved in the affairs of any international student in the USA Program.
- VII. The participant is prohibited from selling, buying, consuming, or being involved in any matter with pornography, alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, and/or illegal drugs of any kind.
- VIII. The participant is prohibited from engaging in sexual activity of any kind or become engaged.
- IX. The participant is prohibited from driving any type of motor vehicle and obtaining a Driver's License.
  - X. The participant is prohibited from hitchhiking, getting tattoos and/or wearing body-piercing.
- XI. The participant must attend and participate in all scheduled school classes and maintain at least a C grade point average. Regular school attendance is mandatory. Any and all school decisions concerning academic performance or personal conduct of the participant are final.
- XII. The participant is completely responsible for all personal property, luggage, and money.
- XIII. Relatives, friends, and guests are not permitted to visit while school is in progress without prior approval of USA Executive Director and the host family.
- XIV. Participants may not be employed on a full-time or part-time basis. However, the participant may accept payment for occasional baby-sitting, tutoring, or yard work if the host family or neighbors offer. The participant is never to demand payment for such services.
- XV. The participant is prohibited from traveling alone without first acquiring written authorization from the natural parents, host family, and the appropriate USA Program Directors.
- XVI. To voluntarily waive my rights as a program participant should I decide to return to my home country prematurely for any personal reasons, other than injury or illness. If so, the participant must agree to forfeit all of his rights as a program participant and immediately return to his home country for violation of any of USA's stated rules. All decisions made by USA Program are final.

# USA PROGRAM and THE PARTICIPANT'S LEGAL GUARDIAN/ PARTICIPANT'S AGREEMENT

- 1. The participant's legal guardians <u>will grant to USA Program</u> full authority to carry out, undertake, and make decisions for all matters relating to the participant's well-being and academic performance.
- 2. USA Program in terms of this agreement will include the participant in its international study program to travel to the United States of America for the purpose of attending private school for one academic year (August May) or one calendar year (January December), while residing with an American host family or boarding school. The sole purpose of USA Program is to benefit the participant in the following areas: Personal Development, Communication Skills, Academic Progress and Cultural Understanding.
- 3. USA Program provides a <u>choice of preferred</u> region/state or private school in the United States of America for application to enroll. It will be up to the chosen private school to determine if the participant meets their requirements for acceptance.
- 4. USA Program will provide the Form I-20 from the private school chosen and the electronic transmission (SEVIS) necessary for the acquisition of a student F-1 Visa. However, USA Program will not be held responsible for the denial of a Visa by any United States government agency (Embassy or Consulate).
- 5. USA Program will provide a <u>boarding school</u> or <u>secure a host family</u> for the participant's entire stay in the U.S. Host families are of all races/ backgrounds with incomes sufficient to afford comfortable standards of living and nurturing home environments. The host family <u>charges</u> a stipend for expenses incurred while hosting the participant. The natural parents are responsible to pay the stipend up front. Delays in placements beyond the control of USA Program may occur. Change of private school will be determined if host placement cannot be secured in a timely manner.
- 6. USA Program agrees to provide to all participants with <u>health/hospitalization</u> <u>insurance</u>, which will be effective upon arrival in the United States of America and will terminate upon conclusion of the academic school semester/year, marking the end of

the USA Program. Insurance does not cover pre-existing conditions, physicals, immunization shots, high-risk sports, dental work, or eye care.

- 7. USA Program provides to all participants (as a group of 15 or more) a mandatory one-week cultural orientation & educational preparation meeting in Orlando, Florida upon their arrival into the United States. The staff of USA Program will conduct daily instruction in English and orientation regarding: Communication & Language, the American Educational System, Host Family Adaptation, Community and Cultural Adjustment, and General Program Rules. USA Program will provide lodging, all meals, transportation, books & classroom supplies, and free tour sites for orientation purpose.
- 8. USA Program guarantees <u>assistance</u>, <u>support</u>, <u>and guidance</u> to the participant for the duration of the USA Program through School Officials, USA Program Local Representatives, and the Main Office in Florida. Cellphone number is available 24-hours a day inside the United States for all program participants.
- 9. The USA Program fee is <u>all-inclusive</u> (may not be broken down by services or discounted). USA Program agrees to provide the participant with an option to renew the USA Program services for an <u>additional academic or calendar year</u>. If a renewal is granted and the USA Program fee is received in full, the validity of this entire contract will be extended.
- 10. USA Program has the <u>right and authority</u> to deny and/or terminate all services stated within this agreement at the discretion of USA Program Executive Director with just cause. If USA Program's services are terminated or not renewed, the participant may not remain in the United States at the same private school and/or with the same host family where the participant was placed by the USA Program, or legal actions will be taken.

#### **PARTICIPANT OBLIGATION**

- I. The participant must abide by all the rules, liability release, standard of conduct agreement and guidelines (Student Manual and Handbook) specified by USA Program from the date that the contract is signed until departure from the United States.
- II. The participant must obey all local, state, and federal laws while residing in the United States and agree to hold USA Program harmless concerning all liabilities arising from the violation of any of these laws. USA Program will not be responsible for providing the participant with legal counsel(s).
- III. The parents/legal guardians of each participant are responsible for purchasing all round-trip airline tickets for travel to the U.S., including all domestic flights and any additional fees associated with the airline tickets or luggage.
- IV. The participant must accept and obey all house rules that are set forth by the host family. The participant must take part in host family activities and is to demonstrate respect, understanding, and care always to the host family.

- V. USA Program will not be responsible for the theft or loss of the participant's personal belongings for the duration of his stay in the U.S. The participant is completely responsible for all personal property, passport, luggage, and spending money.
- VI. The participant must have sufficient spending money to cover all personal expenses for the duration of the USA Program, including but not limited to the following: extra expenditures during the weeklong orientation, tips, charges for excess baggage weight, postage, medical expenses above and beyond insurance coverage, co-pays, necessary immunizations, school supplies/ fees/ tuition/ lunch/ uniforms/ transportation, personal hygiene products, entertainment, dining out, travel expenses, mobile phones, internet, wi-fi, etc.
- VII. The participant is prohibited from traveling alone without first acquiring written authorization from the natural parents, host family, and the USA Program Executive Director.
- VIII. Natural parents, family, and/or friends are not permitted to visit the participant, nor is the participant permitted to travel to the home country while school is in progress without prior approval from USA Program Executive Director and private school officials.
- IX. In the case of the necessary relocation of a participant to another host family, the participant must cooperate completely with the USA Program. USA Program will provide relocation only if it is deemed necessary by the USA Program Executive Directors and is based on incompatibility that is not caused by the participant, or an additional charge may apply.
- X. The participant must contact only USA Program staff should assistance be necessary in dealing with unresolved issues. The participant is prohibited from becoming involved in the affairs of other participants who are participating in the USA Program or any other international student program.
- XI. The participant must attend and participate in all scheduled school classes, obey all school rules, and maintain at least a C grade point average. English class, American History or Government class, and regular school attendance are mandatory. All school decisions concerning academic performance or personal conduct of the participant are final.
- XII. The participant is prohibited from selling, buying, exchanging, consuming, or being involved in any matter with pornography, alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, and/or illegal drugs of any kind.
- XIII. The participant is prohibited from possessing and/or bearing weapons of any kind, including guns, knives, clubs, martial art devices, etc.
- XIV. The participant is prohibited from driving any type of motor vehicle and/or obtaining a Driver's License. The participant is prohibited from hitchhiking.

- XV. The participant is prohibited from engaging in sexual activity of any kind.
- XVI. The participant is prohibited from having <u>frequent</u> contact with other participants, family members, or individuals from his home country.
- XVII. The participant is prohibited from getting tattoos, body-piercing (including ears), and becoming involved with or associated with gangs and/or any other anti-social groups. The participant must maintain proper hygiene. Furthermore, may not become engaged and/or married while participating in the USA Program.
- XVIII. Participants must possess adequate English language proficiency to function successfully in the American high school and host family. If tutorial assistance is deemed necessary, the participant is responsible for all fees associated with this service.
- XIX. Participants may not be employed on a full-time or part-time basis. However, the participant may accept payment for occasional baby-sitting, tutoring, or yard work if the host family or neighbors offer. The participant is never to demand payment for such services.
- XX. The participant must return to his/her home country of origin upon completion and/or termination of the USA Program. The participant cannot exceed his/her stay beyond the time period issued on his/her international student Visa (F-1).
- XXI. If the USA Program Executive Director decides to expulse the participant, the participant must agree to forfeit all his rights of The USA Program and immediately return to his home country for violation of any of USA Program stated rules. All decisions made by the USA Program Executive Director are final. Participants who must return to their home countries from the United States prior to the scheduled departure date for any personal or disciplinary reasons lose all refund rights.

#### **PROGRAM PAYMENTS**

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**Payment Agreement:** After approval to participate in the USA Program and obtaining acceptance letter from the private high school of your choice, the participant's legal guardian (the financially responsible agent) agrees to pay all the USA **Program service** fee mentioned above plus the **private high school tuition & fees** plus the **yearly host family stipend**.

This payment must be sent to USA Program's bank account in Florida no later than 48 hours, or two working days, after receiving school acceptance letter.

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#### **REFUND POLICIES**

USA Program's policy for refunds of <u>program fee</u> for cancellations (withdrawals) and/or denial of Visas is as follows:

- \* Participants may cancel up to 10 (ten) days after signing the USA Program contract. They will receive a full refund of the total program fee paid.
- \* Participants who cancel after placement with a high school will receive a refund of the program fees paid minus US\$ 5,000.00 (Five thousand dollars).
- \* Participants who are denied an F-1 Visa will receive a refund of the program fees paid minus US\$ 2,000.00 (Two Thousand Dollars) for school enrollment process.
- \* No refunds are given to participants who cancel within eight weeks or less prior to departure from their home country.
- \* Participants who do not adhere to the rules, standards, and instructions set forth by USA Program handbooks, manual, probation, and/or elsewhere, may be sent home at their own expense with no refund of fees.
